

Entrance Requirements

International Students in grade 11 can apply; however, at the time of taking the course the applicant must be a grade 12 student with “B” or better average in Math 11 Foundations or Pre-Calculus 11, Physics 11, and English 11. Applicants must be in good standing with school, have good attendance, and be able to attain references from a teacher or school administrator

In addition to the above, applicants must also satisfy a Career Department entrance and language proficiency evaluation administered by Abbotsford School District 34 CORE or Coastal Pacific Aviation.

For students wishing to continue into the UFV Business Administration-Aviation program it is recommended that Accounting 11 or 12, Physics 12, and a second language course be complete. Please see UFV Business Administration-Aviation program guide for more information.

Overview

The AV-100 Ground School Theory Course offered by Abbotsford School District in partnership with Coastal Pacific Aviation at Abbotsford International Airport is a Transport Canada approved (and UFV accredited) course that all pilots must have in order to obtain their license. This course is perfect for individuals who are interested in obtaining their **Private Pilot's License**, and / or those interested in exploring a career in aviation.

Classes will be held at Coastal Pacific Aviation, located at Abbotsford International Airport, two nights per week (2.5hrs each class) for a total of 20 weeks in the first semester (September to January).

Benefits of the Aviation Ground School include:

- High school course credits
- Preferred entry into the joint University of the Fraser Valley/ Coastal Pacific Aviation program
- Coastal Pacific Aviation course credit
- Preferred entry into **UFV Business of Administration-Aviation and/or UFV Aircraft Structures Technician** program.
- Future plans include development of a work experience component in the aviation industry.

Upon successful completion of the course students with 70% or more will earn an instructor recommendation to write the Transport Canada Private Pilot License - Aeroplane (PPAER) exam provided they have completed 10 hours of “flight training”. This will also provide an additional 2-credits at the University of the Fraser Valley.
