



## **ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)**

The Advanced Placement Program® is a cooperative educational project between secondary schools and colleges and universities. AP, which was developed by the U.S. College Board in 1955, offers students the opportunity to take college level courses while still in high school. Depending on performance, students can earn either university credit or advanced placement (acceptance).

## **Recognized by Universities Worldwide**

- For students considering studying outside their home country, AP can serve as a global credential. Universities in over 100 other countries worldwide recognize AP when making admissions decisions.
- Qualifying AP Exam scores earn university credit in nearly all universities in the United States and Canada.


Each college and university determines its own policies regarding AP Exam scores.
